The Partnership for Women and Girls

- The fees for the YWCA's employment education and training programs are waived for women referred by Emerge.
- Girl Scouts and Emerge rent space in the YWCA Frances McClelland Leadership Center for their events.
- Young women from Girl Scouts participated in the YWCA Youth Forum on Race and received a \$ 400 grant from the YWCA to support their action plan against racism.
- There is a Girl Scout troop at the Emerge transitional housing facility and a new troop will soon begin meeting at the YWCA.
- Girl Scout leaders receive training through the YWCA Women's Leadership Program.
- Girl Scouts receive scholarships to attend the annual YWCA Women & Money Conference.
- Women who are receiving counseling from the YWCA, are referred to Emerge if they are experiencing domestic violence.
- The Partnership applied as a group and received the Journal Broadcasting in-kind media grant.
- Anti-Bullying training for girls in Girl Scouts is provided by the YWCA.
- Applications to funding sources are coordinated whenever possible. If one organization is considered to be better positioned for success than the other two organizations, only one of the organizations will submit a proposal.
- Funding requests are strengthened by demonstrating that women and girls from all three partnering organizations will be served whenever one of the organizations is funded.
- Girls in the YWCA after-school programs, TECHgyrls® and Girls With Tools are encouraged to join a Girl Scout troop.
- The YWCA Frances McClelland Leadership Center is the site of the Girl Scout's Annual Girls Leadership Journey Conference

- Women who are resident's at Emerge, receive clothing for job interviews and to begin employment from Your Sister's Closet, a program of the YWCA.
- Facilities for retreats and camp experience for Emerge and the YWCA are provided by the Girl Scouts.
- Girls involved in YWCA and Emerge programs can participate in all Girl Scout activities and receive scholarships to camp.
- Staff from Emerge and Girl Scouts receive racial justice training from the YWCA.
- Staffs from the YWCA and Girl Scouts are trained by Emerge to recognize the signs of domestic violence and abuse.
- It will soon be possible for the websites of all three organizations to be accessed from any of the three individual websites.
- Boxes of Girl Scout cookies are a treat that can always be found at the YWCA and Emerge.
